Renter/Homeowner

As children leave home, they are most likely to rent a place to live, and most often with a roommate. Here are some helpful things to remember when talking with your son or daughter about insurance:

- Many renters are under the impression that their landlord's insurance covers their belongings. It does not.
- Renter's insurance covers your personal possessions even if they are not in the apartment at the time something happens to them. Auto insurance does not cover items stolen from a car – renter's insurance does.
- 3. Renters experience higher rates of crime, theft and burglary than people who own their home.
- 4. Renters are liable if someone is injured in their apartment.
- Renters insurance is not very expensive, and you can further lower the cost by getting a single policy with a roommate.

Life/Health

Health insurance may change for your son or daughter as they leave home or receive benefits from work. Some questions to help them consider the best options include:

- 1. How much will it cost monthly?
- 2. What are the deductibles?
- 3. What doctors & hospitals is part of the plan?
- 4. What is the co-pay?

As children grow older, they often want to know about their parent's coverage. This is a healthy concern – children want to know their parents are taken care of should the need arise. It is often a good idea for a family to develop an insurance plan with their agent that will meet needs as the family matures.
